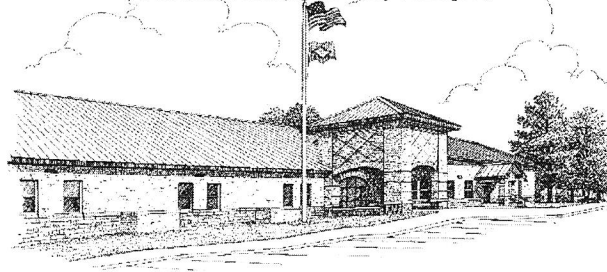

Dear Parents,

The teachers and staff are excited to welcome our students back to campus for the 2021-2022 school year. We look forward to a successful academic year.

We once again begin the school year under challenging circumstances, and we ask you for assistance in helping the school district have a successful school year. Though we have many mitigation strategies in place, you, the parents, are the front line and first line of mitigation for COVID. If your child is not feeling well, keep them home. If your child is running a temperature, please keep them home.

Masks are not currently required; however, they are highly recommended, and we will have masks available at the door when your child enters the building should they choose to wear one. Your child may elect to wear their own rewashable mask as long as it meets HSD dress code requirements.

The school district will continue this year to perform daily temperature checks. We will continue to limit the number of visitors in the buildings. We will have soap available and encourage frequent hand washing. We will have hand sanitizer available in classrooms and encourage frequent hand washing with hand sanitizer. We have spaced out classes to improve social distancing. We will encourage and teach proper respiratory etiquette.

If at some point it becomes necessary to quarantine a student due to either a positive COVID test or a close contact, the district has appointed a District Point of Contact and they will be in touch with you regarding the next steps. Individuals who have tested positive for COVID and recovered within 90 days do not have to quarantine, as long as they do not develop new symptoms. Individuals exposed to a confirmed case of COVID-19 will not need to be quarantined if the exposed individual has no symptoms and both the infected and exposed individual consistently and correctly were wearing a mask. Individuals who are fully vaccinated will not have to quarantine, provided they do not have symptoms.

It is my belief that working together we can have a successful school year for 2021-2022.
